New ARFF Truck




The new Airport Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF) truck has arrived.

Thank you to the contractors, MOT Operations, and Avflight for working together to get this accomplished.




FLY-IN AND PANCAKE FEED



Letter from the Director



It seems like time flies at the Minot International Airport. I can't believe it is already May. The rest of the year is going to be just as busy as our construction season starts to gear up.

We have many projects planned to help maintain, repair, and improve the airport's safety and efficiency. The first project is the taxilane/taxiway reconstruction which includes the replacement of the grass between the T-Hangars with a paved surface. We anticipate this will help with some of the area's drainage issues and also expedite the winter snow removal. Taxiway B2 and a portion of taxiway F are also scheduled to be repaired during this project. The approval of the wetland/wildlife mitigation grants will enable the airport to improve drainage and prevent wildlife attractions on airport property. As we all know birds and planes do not go well together. Crack sealing will begin both landside and airside along with summertime painting. If that wasn't enough on our plates the terminal's restaurant Trestle Tap House is doing a major update to its space in order to better service our passengers.

As we all know the winter was rough with an arctic blast. It took out the Jet A fuel pump. The new redundant pump system just finished up last week. In addition to last year's front-end loader, continuous friction monitoring equipment (CFME), and other equipment, the airport purchased a new Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF) truck. Station 3 anticipates being fully trained on it by mid-month and ready to bring it online at that time.

At the end of 2023, Allegiant added a new destination flight to Sandford/Orlando. This family-friendly destination continues to create high load factors and increased enplanement numbers for the airport. I will be attending ACI-NA's JumpStart Conference mid-month and I hope to entice more flights and destinations from the airlines.

The airport is helping to plan a pancake feed and Fly-In on the General Aviation ramp planned for some time this summer. It has been a very busy and productive year so far for MOT. Let's hope for a summer of blue skies and tailwinds!

Trestle Tap House Renovation


Trestle Tap House is excited about the upcoming renovation of the existing space. The renovation will feature a more modern, sleeker space for travelers to shop, dine and relax.






The Business of Airports




With the addition of the newest destination of Sandford Orlando the Airport has been busier during the first few months of the year than normal. These flights have had consistently high load factors performing well above our averages the first quarter averages in 2023 and the national average.



With the increase of flights, the concessionaires in and around the airport have had growth and a great start to 2024. Comparison to 2021-2023 numbers shows statistically lower averages in the Jan-March timeframe.

Your guests and visitors are your responsibility. If you allow a visitor to drive on the Airport make sure to brief them ahead of time and escort your visitors at all times.


Never leave a guest to find their way off of the Airport alone!


